"The Girl From Krakow" tells the story of a beautiful young Jewess on a desperate search for her missing child who, while on the run from Nazis, falls in love with a woman from the Polish Resistance.

Nazi-occupied Poland, 1942. RITA FEUERSTAHL (late 20s) is a woman on the run: From a loveless, oppressive marriage; from her dashed hopes and dreams of a medical career; and from the powerful secret currents of her sexuality that have recently been awakened by a forbidden love, shaking up her world. And now--with the Nazis hunting down every Jew in Poland and her estranged husband, URS, away in the war— Rita is even forced to run from her Jewish identity too.

SYNOPSIS:

Posing as a Catholic ("Margarita Trushenko") with the help of her anti-Nazi boss, LYDIA, and her courageous friend, ERICH, 20s--who helped her get false identity papers-- Rita must find a way to escape and survive on her own. Her only weapons? Her wits and a small hidden stash of morphine and gold coins, left behind by her husband, who is a doctor. The one blessing from Rita's troubled marriage was their son, STEFAN (4), born as the dark curtain of a Nazi invasion and Holocaust was about to descend on their homeland.

Once the Germans start rounding up Jews into Ghettos as a prelude to the death camps, Rita reluctantly places Stefan in the custody of a mysterious courier for the Polish Resistance, hoping the woman can smuggle her son to safety. But when the courier is captured by the Gestapo and Stefan vanishes without a trace, a terrified Rita is desperate to find and rescue him.

Meanwhile, Rita is pursued by a relentless shark: Nazi SS officer LEIDERITZ, who targets Rita after she makes a dramatic escape from the Jewish Ghetto by assaulting her would-be rapist: a Nazi guard who is the son of a high-ranking German officer. Now a fugitive, Rita travels from city to city, living by her wits and using gold and morphine as bargaining chips to stay one step ahead of Leideritz-- and the many dangerous extortionists who threaten to expose her true identity.(CONT'D)...



Throughout Rita's perilous journey-- which even takes her inside Germany itself, trapped working incognito as a nanny for a family of Nazis-- Rita remains determined to reunite with her Polish lover, DANI (female, 20s): a courageous Jewish Resistance fighter. The pair had an intensely passionate romance earlier in the war. But, fearful of committing to a relationship with a woman, Rita had pulled back from Dani-- to Rita's never-ending regret. And now the war has separated them, leaving Rita with the crushing realization that she's made a terrible mistake-- and may have lost the love of her life forever.

Before they were split up by the war, Dani had told Rita: "If you find your courage, I will find you." But Rita wonders if she's truly capable of courage. The kind that Dani has, in being fully herself and willing to die, if need be, to save others. The kind that Erich has-- as a self-declared "proud homosexual Jew" who rescues other Jews in swashbuckling fashion and laughs in the face of danger.

Will Rita find the courage to go on a dangerous mission into the terrifying "house of horrors" known as the Warsaw Ghetto— to find and rescue her missing son? What happens if she eventually finds Stefan—but her son no longer remembers her? Will Rita have the courage to sacrifice her own needs to do what's best for him-- even if it breaks her heart? And even if Rita can truly "find her courage", survive the war, and-- in all ways— stop running from her true identity, will her soulmate, Dani, find her again-- so they can heal their hearts and finally make a life together? Or might Dani have surprising secrets of her own that threaten to tear them apart forever?



Why The Girl from Krakow?

There have been many stories centered around World War 2 and the horrific actions of Nazis throughout Europe, and this story too is inspired by true events. In fact, the main character, Rita, is based in part on the author's mother who chronicled her experiences as a survivor of the holocaust in her memoir TO TELL AT LAST. But apart from the fact that this story is about survival, it is a moving love story of two Jewish women whose love for each other gives them the reason to do whatever they can to survive. And the dramatic plot twists after the war when Dani finds the fiancée she never mentioned and Rita learns that her son, now 6, is still alive lead to an unexpected and memorable climax.




