

INSPIRED BY TRUE EVENTS

In an era where identity and authenticity dominate global conversations, 'The Girl from Krakow' draws from the extraordinary true story of Blanca Rosenberg—a Jewish mother who survived the Holocaust by living a double life as a Nazi officer's housekeeper.

Blanca lost her child while in the Kolomyja ghetto, but managed to escape the ghetto in October 1942 with help of a family friend. Her survival strategy involved assuming a false identity and passing as an Aryan which led her to secure a job as a housekeeper for a high-ranking German officer. She used that position to assure her own survival, save her best friend, and assist other Jews in hiding. She describes her experiences in her memoir, 'To Tell At Last.'

RITA

Rita Feuerstahl (20s) is a blonde, blue-eyed Polish Jewish woman with natural elegance and a formidable internal strength that emerges through extraordinary circumstances. Beginning as a cautious medical student trapped in a marriage of convenience, Rita undergoes a profound transformation when the Nazi occupation forces her to navigate a treacherous world through wit, resilience, and increasingly courageous choices.

Fluent in multiple languages and possessing striking Aryan features that allow her to move in dangerous circles, Rita lives a high-stakes double life that constantly tests her ingenuity and nerve. Her quest to protect her young son Stefan gives her character a compelling emotional urgency, while her unexpected romance with the passionate resistance fighter Dani adds layers of sexual awakening and authentic self-discovery.

Rita's journey spans from timid compliance to brave defiance, presenting a psychologically nuanced role that requires both subtlety and emotional intensity as she discovers her own power and capacity for profound moral choices in the face of history's darkest hour.

DANI

Dani (20s) is a petite, dark-haired Polish Jewish woman with intense brown eyes and an indomitable spirit that belies her small stature. A fighter in the Polish Resistance with remarkable combat skills, she embodies fearless conviction, declaring she's "less scared of dying than not knowing what's worth dying for". Unlike Rita's cautious nature, Dani lives authentically without apology, becoming both Rita's passionate lover and catalyst for self-discovery.

Her character combines physical courage with profound emotional intelligence – a compelling blend of warrior and nurturer. As the war reaches its conclusion, Dani confronts an unexpected internal conflict between her resistance identity and family expectations, creating rich psychological tension that tests her commitment to living truthfully.

ERICH


Erich Klein (20s) is a tall, charismatic Polish Jew in his twenties with delicate features and boundless chutzpah who becomes Rita's lifeline in the Karpatyn ghetto. Possessing an ironclad work permit and quick wit that serves as both weapon and shield, delivering cutting observations with a smile that masks his strategic brilliance. By night, he meticulously crafts tools for resistance while maintaining his cover by day.

His defining moment comes when he proudly declares his homosexuality to a Nazi officer during selection – a stunning act of defiance that allows him to later orchestrate a daring escape from a deportation train. Through his actions, Erich becomes not just Rita's protector but her moral compass, demonstrating that true courage means embracing one's authentic self even when the world would destroy you for it.


